CHEO is recruiting a Department Chief and full-time pediatric anesthesiologist to actively lead clinical care, teaching and research in the Department of Anesthesiology and Pain Medicine. As one of 8 CHEO Medical Department Chiefs, the Chief of Anesthesiology and Pain Medicine is a key medical leader within the organization. The successful candidate will oversee the quality and safety of clinical care provided by the Department, and as Co-Medical Director of Perioperative Services will work in close collaboration with the Chief of Surgery and the Director of perioperative services to co-lead the clinical Perioperative Services Patient Care leadership Team (PCLT) and participate in the CHEO led regional surgical program that utilizes operating room capacity in the region to reduce surgical wait times and deliver care closer to home.

The Department Chief also has responsibility for the administrative and academic activity of the department. In a dyad model in collaboration with their operational leaders, the position is responsible for the ongoing evaluation, design and implementation of perioperative delivery processes to provide excellence in acute care responsive to child and youth health needs.

The Department consists of 21 anesthesiologists and one pediatric anesthesia fellow with a dedicated team of anesthesia assistants affiliated with our department providing on call coverage.

The Department is an integral part of the University of Ottawa's Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada certified residency program in Anesthesiology and Pain Medicine and runs a Pediatric Anesthesiology Fellowship program.
